Richardson appoints Vanzi to state bench

Gov. Bill Richardson Thursday appointed Albuquerque attorney Linda M. Vanzi to sit on the District Court of New Mexico Second Judicial District bench.

Vanzi, who previously served as an attorney for the City of Albuquerque and sat on the Albuquerque Technical Vocational Institute Labor Arbitration Board, fills the vacancy created by the retirement of Judge Frank Allen.

"Linda has a reputation as a fair, even-tempered lawyer with a keen understanding of the law, and the issues facing judges today," said Richardson in a press release. "She is known as a woman of integrity, who is extremely competent, thoughtful and thorough. We are truly fortunate Linda has accepted this nomination to the bench," he said.

According to the governor's office, Vanzi is experienced in civil rights, employment law, child abuse and neglect, personal injury, and commercial law. Vanzi holds a bachelor's degree from Marymount College and is a 1995 graduate of the University of New Mexico School of Law.
